- W T B 2. Managed sawmill, distilleries and gristmills.

- W T B 6. Said prayers and hymns twice daily.
- W T B 7. Made their own clothes.
- W T B 8. Received allotments of flour and pork to supplement diet.
- W T B 9. Made their own soap.
- W T B 10. Servants made soap and candles.
- W T B 11. Stuffed mattresses with corn husks.
- W T B 12. Stuffed mattresses with soft down (feathers).
- W T B 13. Bought clothing ready-made.
- W T B 14. Made jams and jellies.
- W T B 15. Grew food in their gardens.
